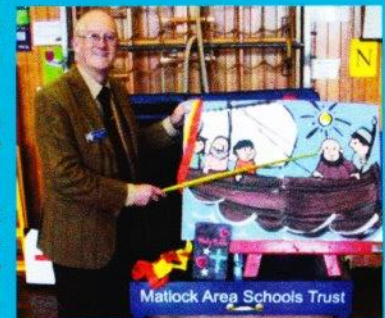
**HE WHO HAS EARS, LET HIM HEAR - Rev 2 v 7**

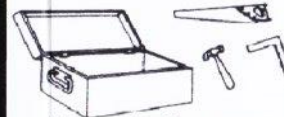
